Stars In the Night



Material and cutting

Block size Quilt size	8" 45"	11" with the sashing
Material	Yards	Cuttings
blue	1 1/2 y.	9 strips 3" x width of the fabric for the sashing. 4 strips 3" x width of fabric for the "off checkers" 36 D 36 E
yellow	1/4 y.	18 B
yellow-orange	1/2 y.	18 B 36 C
violet	1/8 y.	9 A
orange	11/4 y.	12 strips 3"x width of fabric
Lining	1 1/2 y.	1 panel
Batting	4" wider	and longer than top




Enlarge 200% to have the correct block size.

Assembly

Make the templates in your preferred materiel, trace on fabric and cut.

BE CAREFUL THE TEMPLATES ARE NOT REVERSIBLE

Sew the pieces D and C together, and the pieces E and B together. See diagram of the block and fig.2



Sew the piece D+C with the long side of piece A. It is half a seam...see fig 3.

Add the piece E+B; this is a full seam, and D+C until you can finish the first seam.

Sew around each block a 3" strip of background fabric. You will have a 14" block that you will trim at 11" allowing the star to be off center differently in each block. (Fig 4).

Assemble the 9 blocks 3 x 3.

Off checkers borders.

Take one 3" orange strip and sew it to a 3" blue strip, and slice it in section 2 " to 3" wide a little off the vertical. (fig 5).

To sew it back together, rotate every other piece to have a checker. (fig 6). Sew 4 borders.

Once you have your 4 borders cut them 3" wide.(fig7).



Sew the "off checkers border" to the quilt and add the 3" orange strip as the last border.

Layer the quilt lining, batting, and the top. Baste. Quilt in-the ditch around the stars and steeple in the background. I did a spiral in the middle of the stars. Bind the quilt to finish.
