

"QUICK SCREEN BAG & COIN PURSE"



This simple bag and coin purse is a great project to make for a beginning sewer. You will learn some basic sewing skills that you will use in many future projects. I know will you enjoy this so much you may have to make more than one!

Supplies:


Baby Lock Design Pro or Denim Pro 1/4-yard fashion fabric 44-45" wide Solar window screen 36" wide Black all-purpose thread Thread to match fabric 1/8 yard fusible interfacing Pressing cloth Fabric marking pen 1/2" button Spring toggle 7" zipper 5" x 12" piece of Heat N Bond Vinyl[™]

Instructions:


Cut:

One piece from screen 24" x 11" and one-piece 7-1/2" diameter circle. Cut 2 pieces from fabric 1-1/2" x 45" and 1 piece 7-1/2" x 25". Cut 1 piece interfacing 3-3/4" x 25".

- 1. Fuse interfacing to wrong side of 25" x 7-1/2" piece of fabric, matching long edges.
- 2. Fold 1-1/2" wide pieces in half, matching long edges and press.
- Open and fold the long edges to center and press. Set these aside, they will be used for the straps. (Illustration 1)




- 4. Thread machine with black all-purpose thread in the needle and bobbin.
- 5. Pin together 24" x 11" piece of screen and 25" x 7- 1/2" fabric. Match long edges, pin along edge with interfacing, interfacing side up, leaving 1/2" of fabric extended at both ends.
- 6. Sew together using a 5/8" seam. This will be the main body of the bag.
- 7. Press seam to set stitches covering screen with pressing cloth.
- 8. Open flat and press seam toward fabric again, covering screen with pressing cloth.
- 9. Press under 1/2" on opposite side of edge of fabric. (Illustration 2)
- 10. Fold fabric right sides together, matching folded edge to seamed edge, stitch ends using a 1/2" seam. (Illustration 3)



- 11. Clip corners, turn right side out, and press.
- 12. Thread machine with matching thread.
- 13. Pin folded edges of fabric together and top stitch 1/8" from edge of fabric making sure to catch under side of fabric.
- 14. Next, stitch along the long edges of the narrow strips that were pressed earlier. These will be the straps.
- 15. Using your fabric-marking pen mark buttonholes on each end of fabric 1/2" down and 1/2" over from edge.
- 16. Fold in half and mark buttonhole in the center 1/2" from top edge.

- 17. Mark 4 more buttonholes, 2 on each side 4" from center and 1/2" from top edge. You should have 7 buttonholes marked on the fabric.
- 18. Make buttonhole at each marking, using 1/2" button in the buttonhole foot. Cut open buttonholes.
- 19. Pin the bag body section around the circle (bag base); you will need to use several pins; overlapping the short edges.
- 20. Pin straps in the seam, approximately 6" apart, one strap on each side of the overlap. (Illustration 4)
- 21. Using a 5/8" seam sew around the circle.
- 22. Next using a zigzag stitch, sew along overlapped edges of screen only; do not stitch the fabric section. (Illustration 5)



Coin Purse

Cut one piece from fabric 5" x 12" and fuse Heat N BondTM(follow package instructions). Cut this piece into 2 pieces, one 5" x 5", and the remaining should be 5" x 7".

- 1. Fold under 1/2" along one 5" edge of each piece.
- 2. Pin one section to zipper matching fabric edge to end of zipper.
- Using zipper foot, sew 1/8" from folded edge. (Illustration 6)
- 4. Repeat for remaining section.
- 5. Move zipper pull to end of zipper and trim excess off zipper.
- 6. Fold right sides together, match raw edges and sew together using a 1/2" seam allowance.
- 7. Trim edges to $\frac{1}{4}$ " and clip corners.
- 8. Turn right side out.
- 9. Place money and ID in coin purse, put this in the bag with swimsuit, sport shoes, or favorite toys and you are ready to go!




